# 12th annual FIT For Charity Run held in Tokyo

Over 5,300 participants and volunteers from across our industry ~
 Financial industry raises over JPY 58 million for local charities ~

The twelfth annual Financial Industry in Tokyo (FIT) For Charity Run was held today around Meiji Jingu Gaien running course in Shinjuku-ku. This year, over 5,300 individuals from 90 financial services and related foreign and domestic firms came together to raise JPY58,879,500 (subject to final confirmation).

Funds are raised from participating companies and individuals through sponsorship, participation fees and donations, as well as t-shirt and raffle sales.

The FIT For Charity Run is a charity event organised by the financial community and related industries in Tokyo that aims to raise donations in support of non-profit organisations that conduct local community activities. The FIT For Charity Organising Committee was established soon after the major earthquake off the coast of Sumatra and subsequent tsunami in the Indian Ocean in late 2004. The very first FIT For Charity Run was held in 2005 and, since then, has become a landmark annual event across the capital city's financial sector.
